Nine and one-half years: 114 months. To some, that would sound like an eternity while to others it is a mere blink of an eye. For me, this time frame is both. This is the time I've been blessed and privileged to have spent with you as pastor, teacher and friend. Now the time has come for a new chapter of our lives to unfold and a new journey to begin. As I prepare to retire from active pastoral ministry, I want to share a few thoughts with you, if I may.

First, I want you to know how special you each personally are to us and how very much your love and friendship has meant and continues to mean to us. Yes, I say "us" because even though Cathy has claimed a new life with God in heaven, she is still a very real presence in my life. Retiring can be a difficult and stressful time in a person's life – new traditions, new experiences, new "rules" to follow. But I have to say from the very first moment Cathy and I came to you at Arcade United Church of Christ, Congregational and all the surrounding area, we have felt nothing but your warmth, encouragement, love and acceptance. You have made us part of your family - not only church family, but your personal families as well. Together, we have shared laughter, joy, tears, sadness, meals, birthdays, graduations and anniversaries – everything that makes for family. Yes, there have been times when we've not seen eye-to-eye on certain issues. And yes, there have been times that I have erred in decisions or practices as your Pastor and as an individual. But never, to my knowledge, has there been any time that our mutual love and respect has not overcome these differences and spanned these mistakes. You are – each of you – some of the most wonderful persons God has ever created!! And we thank God and you for allowing us to share a part of your lives.

In addition to your personal love and friendship, Cathy and I also give thanks for the community of faith of which we have been a part these 9 ½ years – Arcade UCC, Congregational. We've often read the biblical accounts of the early church and how everyone looks after everyone else; how they shared finances, labors, provisions for day-to-day living – everything, because that's the way Jesus taught them to live! The success of the whole was integrally dependent on the care of the individuals comprising the whole. This is our experience with you at UCC, Congregational. Your willingness to work together in projects both big and small; your

commitment to the opinions of all; your dedication to Jesus, the Christ, in all things; your willingness to look at programs and ministries other than what has been your traditions; your enthusiasm with which you undertake every part of church life is a blessing to all who are in any way a part of our congregation and an example to everyone of how church should be!

As I think of things and people of which and for whom I am grateful, I could easily go on and on. But I won't do that to you. Instead, I'll simply commend you – each and every one of you – on your faith as followers of Jesus, the Christ. Reality tells us that UCC, Congregational is a small community of faith in rural western New York. Reality tells us we are an ethnically ancestrally diverse congregation imbued with the traits of working hard, loving life, caring for our families and friends as well as being committed to social justice and just plain doing what is right throughout our 205 years of existence. Reality also tells us the faith with which you live your lives – every one of you – is your strength and foundation. Over the past 9 ½ years, together we've faced some less than smooth times and challenges. Many we have overcome while some are still in the process of being overcome. But without a doubt, **ALL** have been addressed with a firm and unwavering faith in our Triune God – Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer. Your attitudes, your plan of action, your willingness to follow God's lead is a result of the faith with which each of you has been blessed and which you have learned to rely upon in every aspect of life. I give thanks for your faith and pray that all your days might continue in and with a growing of that faith as you are "re-charged" daily with the presence of the Holy Spirit in your life.

Being out of sight does NOT mean you will be out of my mind or heart!! Be assured, I will carry with me, wherever I go, the fond thoughts of each of you and the cherished memories of our time together. I will keep you in prayer for God's continued guidance and abundant showering of blessings. I will draw from you those practices and examples I have found to be so encouraging and uplifting. I will keep ever so precious the blessing of your friendship. But most of all, I will always love you with the same depth and compassion you have loved me. Shalom, my dear friends – Shalom!

FINANCIAL NEWS


